

Fort McKay E-Learning School

- Can safely accommodate 15 students per classroom.
- There are two main classrooms, and two classroom teachers for core academic courses.
- The Sewing Room will be used for Career and Technology Studies Courses in sewing.
- For now, CTS Foods Courses will not be offered.
- Modified Physical Education.
- Students can complete coursework in-class. School resources will not leave the building.
- Students who must stay home or want to do homework can access coursework online.

Scenario 1

Illness Protocol

If you are a school employee, student, or visitor, and you don't feel well, STAY HOME.

Use the daily screening questionnaire, included in this booklet, before sending your child to school.

What happens if you feel unwell after you arrive at school?

- You must go to the school's isolation/infirmary room and wear a face covering until your family picks you up.
- The school will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- After leaving the school, complete the online COVID-19 self-assessment tool. The tool advises if testing is required and allows users to book an appointment immediately.
- Anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 is asked to notify Fort McKay E-Learning School to ensure proper cleaning and public-health measures are followed.

What if your child has symptoms, but also has a medical condition like allergies?

Students with allergies or other medical conditions that cause symptoms similar to COVID-19 should get at least one negative COVID-19 test before the start of the school year. You know your child best. If their symptoms are normal for them and do not change, your child can go

What happens if there is a confirmed COVID-19 case in our school?

1 Confirmed Case

The school will be on an ALERT status. AHS will be informed, and parents will be notified. Contact tracing will be done, and any public health orders followed.

2 or More Confirmed Cases (within a 14-day period)

This is considered an OUTBREAK. AHS will be informed and will work with the school to complete contact tracing. Parents will be informed. Public health measures from the Zone Medical Officer of Health will be followed, and we may move to partial in-class or at-home education.

5 or More Confirmed Cases

Parents will be informed. This information will be reported AHS website. The school will work with public health on contact tracing and monitoring ongoing disease activity. Student will do at-home learning until the outbreak is determined to be over.

The privacy of affected students or staff will be protected.
